

# JC Products Reeds and Some of Their Uses In Call Making

## Reed Nomenclature:

**MV = Medium Voice**

**LV = Loud Voice (can stand up to more stress and harder blowing)**

**MVDR = Medium Voice Double Reed (double reeds are normally much more raspy than single reeds)**

**LVDR = Loud Voice Double Reed (double reeds are normally much more raspy than single reeds)**

## The Reeds:

### **LV 003 Brass**

Makes a good mellow cottontail - bladed to a raspy jack rabbit, but easy to over do and ruin the reed. Makes a good snowshoe hare.

### **LV002**

Good raspy jackrabbit, coon squaller and bear cub squaller. Bladed and played softly a great fawn bleat (the standard commercial fawn bleat) can also be used as a squirrel call reed in a pinch.

### **MV 002**

Good cottontail reed. Some call makers will tell you that the louder you play it the raspier it gets. True. But the reed wears out fast when you really get aggressive on it due to over stressing the reed. Better as a nice mellow cottontail reed.

### **LVDR 002**

Nice very raspy cottontail. Can be bladed for a jack but again, easy to over do. Makes a good snowshoe hare. An alternative Squirrel Call reed.

**MVDR 002**

A bit higher pitched but a very good cottontail.

**LVDR 025**

Very high pitched cottontail

**MVDR 025**

Another high pitched distress reed. Baby cottontail

**LV 025**

Another very high pitched reed, not raspy, but a good baby cottontail

**MV 025**

Very high pitched.

**LVDR 005**

The standard commercial squirrel call reed. It needs to be bladed heavily though.

**MVDR 005**

Double Stainless and mylar, Same as lvdr-005 except medium voice.

**LV-010-LS**

LS=long sleeve & short sleeve. Hawk screamer.

Also the best coaxer, or Field Rat reed available.
