

“O” Ring Sizing Chart

The basic rule of thumb for “O” rings on game calls is to use an “O” ring that is 1/16th inch SMALLER than the Outside Diameter of your tennon, and 1/16 inch thick.

There are several types of “O” rings available. The “O” rings you find in places like Home Depot or Lowes are usually Buna – N “O” rings. While they will work, they have a short life span and tend to fail at the worst time. I use Neoprene “O” rings, which are both weather and ozone resistant and seem to hold up much better..

Common “O” Ring sizes are listed below

For a 1/2” Tennon use an SAE 011 “O” Ring. This “O” ring has a 7/16” Outside Diameter

For a 5/8” Tennon, use an SAE 013 “O” Ring. This “O” ring has a 9/16” Outside Diameter

For a 3/4” Tennon, use an SAE 015 “O” Ring. This “O” ring has an 11/16” Outside Diameter

The “O” Rings used on the reeds of Deer Grunt and other calls with adjustable reeds is an SAE 011 O Ring with a 7/16” Outside Diameter
